

## **What is Bible Jeopardy?**

It is a game played much like the “Jeopardy” game on TV except all the questions come from the Bible. Just print off each category on a piece of paper (preferably onto card stock). It is best to use different colors so it is easier to separate the pieces after the game is finished.

Using a marker or crayon number the back of the questions according to the value of the question – the hardest for your students to answer will be the highest number and so forth. You can use whatever numbers you choose – what ever will encourage your students to want to learn the info in the lessons. For example you can start with the easiest question being 50 or even 100 points. Print the number values on the back of each card for the category. Do this for each category you use. Continue to add categories as you study more lessons. The categories in this month’s edition are about JESUS in John chapter 1, but you can make more of your own for any lessons you wish.

Let the students pick a category he wishes to answer and the number value he wishes. Then you read the answer and let the student give the question. You may have to help your students form the questions at first until they get the hang of it. If they get the question correct they keep it to the end of the game. Each card has the answer, question and book, chapter & verse where it is found. This is also handy if you are out and someone else needs to take your class. They can use the jeopardy you have prepared and do your class easily. You can even keep your cards for another class later on.

Bible Jeopardy is a great Bible learning activity or a review of your quarter. When you have ended the class – let the students count the points to see who wins. If you find yourself not getting through all your categories as you add more, then just leave out the ones your students know the best. This way they can learn the others as well.

Bible Jeopardy can be used for classes of all ages beginning with first graders through teens. Just make sure your questions and answers are age appropriate. And since you the teacher make up the questions you learn even more about the Word to teach!
