

For clothes line charts:

Stretch a clothes line (just a nylon or cotton cord) across a wall in your class. It can be against the wall as long as students can use clothespins to hang up the items as they are earned.

Print or copy this sheet on light weight cardstock. You may use colored sheets (green, blue, yellow, etc.) or print on white and let children color the clothing before hanging on the line. Cut each garment out before class. Clip art was used so just trim off any hangers that may appear on the clothes. When two items are on one section you may want to cut them apart and use them as two separate items. You may want to store the cutout pieces inside a book or lay under something heavy so as to keep them from curling-up before use if necessary. The heavier the paper the less likely they will curl.

Hang one item of clothing on the line for attendance—one when the child says memory work or how ever needed for your class. Each child has a separate line to fill (if there is room) or each can use a specific color to them and all can hang on one long line. As the line fills with clothes they can identify which one is theirs by color or by the name you write on the back of each item. Use however it works for you.
